Dan likes color and loves to place complimentary colors next to each other in his paintings to make the colors "pop." Some of his work shows his love of light and his attempt to capture changing light and these paintings look different in different light or when viewed from different angles.

Recently, Dan has been working with water-soluble colored pencils which he blends and darkens and "fixes" with transparent acrylic glazes. He also likes the shimmer of metallic colored pencils and "interference" paints (which change color as the direction of light striking them changes).

Needless to say, Dan's favorite subject matter is flowers.
